

This Indenture, made this 14 day of May____, 1866, between Ellen Johnson a minor negro girl, born on the 20th day of August____, 1860, and Robert V Pollett of the County of Franklin, and State of Kentucky, Witnesseth:

That the said Ellen Johnson, is hereby bound as an apprentice to the said Robert V Pollett, to dwell and continue to serve from this date until the 20th day of Augt____, 1878. When the said girl will be eighteen years of age, during said time, the said Ellen Johnson shall faithfully serve and obey the said Robert V Pollett in all things lawful, and demean herself as a good and faithful apprentice. And the said Robert V Pollett in consideration thereof, undertakes to teach and instruct the said Ellen Johnson in the business of a Seemstress House Keeper in the best manner he can, and furnish to the said girl proper Medical attention, good clothing and food, and to treat her with humanity, and to give her a good suit of clothes at the end of her apprenticeship, and to pay to her the sum of ~~one hundred~~ fifty dollars.

Provided however, that if the said Pollett shall teach, or cause to be taught, the said girl to read and write, the said Pollett is not bound to pay said Ellen any money at the end of her apprenticeship.
